A rather flashy and high-end example of this low-mintage date.

Only a few abrasions seen on Ike's cheek limit the grade of this piece.

#### PCGS Price Guide: \$35

Minimum Bid: \$15

#### 10/23

#### 1842-O Seated Dime - VG+

A choice example of this underrated semi-key date.

The surfaces are a pleasing original gray and most letters of LIBERTY are still visible. A seldom-encountered offering.

#### This Months Mystery-



This month we look at a 1918(P) Lincoln cent that appears to have a very large die crack on the reverse. But, is it a die crack?



Is this a die clash?" "No", it is not. This is the answer; it is a lesser known form of die deterioration which transfers design outlines from one die to the other. Since there are many types of design transfer (clashed dies, brockages, etc.), it is preferable to call this type of design transfer "Progressive Indirect Design Transfer" or "PIDT". Other synonyms you're likely to encounter are "heavy design transfer", "internal metal displacement phenomenon (IMDP)", and "ghosting". Progressive indirect design transfer chiefly involves large, centrally-located design elements. It's most likely to occur in thinner denominations.
