A picture-perfect Buffalo nickel free from blemishes or distractions of any note. Sharp details and exceptional eye-appeal.

1939-S Walking Liberty Half Dollar - About Uncirculated

The S mint issues for the 'Walker' half dollars from the 30s & 40s are typically weakly struck, however this piece exhibits much of the fine details that are often lacking even from near-gem uncirculated examples of this date.

Only a modest amount of circulation is seen on this specimen and it has no distracting flaws. An under-rated date in terms of scarcity, as this date is usually encountered in much lower grades.

Last month we were asked if it is possible to have a two headed or tailed coin or token. The answer is "yes", it is possible and there are known examples. A two-tailed clad dime (1 known specimen, probably from 1965) and two-tailed clad quarter (2-3 known specimens, probably from 1965) are known to exist. There is also an 1859 Indian cent with two obverse faces (unique) and the 1863 Broas Pie Bakers token (Civil War Store card token) with two obverses as well. Of all the head/head or tail/tail coins and tokens, the Broas token is the most common.

Minimum Bid: \$60
