Last month we looked at a 1941(P) Lincoln cent that seems to be struck with very, very late state dies. The coin has been manipulated outside the mint. The dies that did strike the coin were not very late die state or even late die state, but were more than likely mid die state. Taking that into consideration, the supposed cold metal flow lines seen would not exist in that early of a die state. This coin was subjected to a directional heat source to produce the wavy lines.
