# What Happened Here?



Let us switch gears a bit and look at an early \$5.00 gold U. S. coin from 1832.

What is wrong with this coin?







Last month, we looked at a 1919(P) Lincoln cent seems to have seen better days, but the obverse has random connected lines resembling the surface of mars. While the reverse has the same circulation wear, the lines are not present on that face of the coin.

So, what happened here?

The coin has been subjected to a chemical that etched the surface of obverse. This generally happens when a coin is left face down in mud or on the ground.
